Laramie County absentee ballot requests surpass 2010 and 2014 elections

CHEYENNE—The number of absentee ballots for the Nov. 6 General Election has already surpassed those sent in the 2010 and 2014 elections, according to Laramie County Clerk Debra Lee. Absentee and early voting started Sept. 21 and will end on Nov. 5, the day before the General Election.

As of Friday, Sept. 28, Lee reported the Clerk's office mailed 2469 absentee ballots, a 48% increase from the number sent in 2014 and a 65% increase from 2010. In the first week of early voting, more than 500 persons voted at the polling site in the atrium of the Laramie County Governmental Complex, 309 W 20th St.

The early voting polling site is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. There will be no early voting on Monday, Oct. 8, due to the closure of the county building on Columbus Day.

Registered voters may request an absentee mail ballot by calling 307-633-4242 or emailing election@laramiecountyclerk.com. Voters need to provide their name, residential address in Laramie County, date of birth, and mailing address.
