Voters may get absentee ballots for LCCC bond election at County Clerk's office Nov. 1-6

Nov. 6 is last day to request an absentee ballot for next week's election

Voters who want an absentee ballot for next week's LCCC bond election may pick one up at the election office of the Laramie County Clerk starting tomorrow (Nov. 1). The last day a voter can request an absentee ballot is Monday, Nov. 6, the day prior to the Nov. 7 election.

"We are past the time when we can mail ballots, so we are asking voters who want to vote early to come to our office and we will provide them with a ballot they can take with them," said Laramie County Clerk Debra Lee.

Voters can receive an absentee ballot from the election office in the Laramie County Governmental Complex, 309 W. 20th Street, during normal business hours. A voter who cannot come in person may designate a family member or other person to pick up a ballot by providing the clerk's office with written authorization.

Since the start of absentee voting on Sept. 28, the Laramie County Clerk's office has sent nearly 1500 absentee ballots to voters who requested them. According to Lee, more than 75 percent of these voters had returned their ballots to the clerk's office as of Oct. 30.

Absentee voters have until 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 7, to return their ballots to the clerk's office. Ballots arriving after the Nov. 7 deadline will not be counted.

"If you have not yet mailed your absentee ballot, we recommend you deliver it to the clerk's office," said Lee.

On Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 7, voters may cast ballots between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. at any of the 13 vote centers in the county. Qualified electors may also register to vote at a vote center by providing a government-issued photo ID, such as a Wyoming driving license.

Lee noted the vote centers are the same ones used during last November's presidential election. A sample ballot for the LCCC bond election, list of vote centers and their locations are available on the Laramie County Clerk's website at <http://www.laramiecountyclerk.com/elections.aspx>.
