Voter turnout continues to be high for Primary Election

CHEYENNE – With just 10 days into absentee and early voting for next month’s Primary Election, the Laramie County Clerk’s office has sent out more absentee ballots than they did for the 2014 mid-term elections, according to Laramie County Clerk Debra Lee.

“Our office has mailed more than 1200 ballots since the start of absentee voting on July 6. That’s 126 more than were sent in a 40-day period in 2014,” said Lee.

Voters have also turned up in high numbers for early voting in the atrium of the Laramie County Governmental Complex. In the first 10 days of voting, over 800 voters cast their ballots, with three days of 100-plus voters. “That’s a record turnout for so early in the process. Our highest turnout so far was 111 voters on July 16,” said Lee.

Absentee and early voting started July 6. The last day for early voting in the county building is Monday, Aug. 20. The early voting site is open Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. There will be no voting on Wednesday, July 25, due to the Cheyenne Day closure of county offices. Early voting will resume on Thursday, July 26.

Voters may request an absentee ballot by calling the Clerk’s election office at (307) 633-4242 or by e-mailing election@laramiecountyclerk.com. Voters must provide their name as it appears on the voter list, date of birth, residential address in the county, mailing address (if different), and a contact telephone number.
