Laramie County Clerk's office to conduct voter outreach at high schools, college

CHEYENNE –High school and college students interested in the upcoming election will have the opportunity to register and ask questions about voting during voter outreach events at high schools on Friday, Oct. 12, and at Laramie County Community College on Tuesday, Oct. 16.

Students, faculty and others interested in registering to vote will have the opportunity to fill out an application prior to the November General Election and get information on where to vote.

Qualifications for registration and voting are U.S. citizenship, Laramie County residency, age 18 or older by Election Day, and voting rights restored if convicted of a felony. Registrants must present a valid, government-issued identity document, such as a Wyoming driving license, U.S. passport or student ID. Persons unable to attend an outreach event can still register and vote at the Laramie County Governmental Complex, 309 W 20th St., until Nov. 5, or at a vote center on General Election Day, Nov. 6.

The outreach schedule for high schools on Friday, Oct 12, is: South High – 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.; Central High – 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.; East High – 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.
