#### **Fire District #1 bond election on Tuesday, Nov. 5**

#### **Only voters living in Fire District #1 are eligible to vote in the election**

Voters living within the boundaries of Laramie County Fire District #1 may cast their vote in the district's bond election on Tuesday, Nov. 5. Polling will take place at the fire station, located at 207 E. Allison Road, in Cheyenne, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Persons who are qualified electors may also register and vote at that time.

The bond election, which was called by the Laramie County Fire District #1 board, seeks voter approval for equipment purchases and fire station improvements through the issuance of up to \$3.1 million in general obligation bonds. Interest on the bonds may not exceed 3.5 percent per annum and would mature in six years. If approved by voters, bonds will be payable from ad valorem property taxes levied against all taxable property in the District in amounts sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds in each year.

Fire District #1 is a 180-square mile area that extends south of the City of Cheyenne to the Colorado border. According to Laramie County Clerk Debra Lee, there are approximately 2800 registered voters in the district, which encompasses voters in precincts 4-8, 4-9, 5-1, 5-4, 7-1, and 7-4.

Voters can also deliver their absentee ballots to the polling place at 207 E. Allison Road on Election Day until 7:00 p.m. Any ballots returned after the 7:00 p.m. deadline will not be counted.
