

## LOST AND STOLEN FIREARMS INVESTIGATIONS

Each year, thousands of firearms are lost or stolen. The owner's ability to adequately identify these firearms is central to Law Enforcement's ability to investigate these crimes and losses. Insurance claims and reacquisition of recovered firearms will also hinge on the ability to correctly identify these firearms.

By completing this record and maintaining it in a safe location, separate from your firearms, you will be taking an important first step in the effort to prevent thefts and keep firearms out of the hands of criminals.

## WHAT TO DO IF YOUR FIREARMS ARE STOLEN OR LOST

- Immediately contact your local Law Enforcement Agency to file a report.
- Provide a complete description of each firearm, especially the serial number. You will need to know the approximate value of each firearm. Also note if each firearm has other identifying information, such as an engraving, an identifiable scratch or mark, or identifiable features (i.e. Hogue grips, a rifle scope, or night sights).
- Obtain a case number from the responding officer. You may want to notify your homeowner's or renter's insurance agent as well.
- If your firearm is found or recovered by you, notify Law Enforcement so that it can be removed from their lost/stolen list. Law Enforcement will enter each firearm into a national database (only if a serial number is provided). If the firearm is recovered by Law Enforcement, every effort will be made to have it returned to its rightful owner.
